Subject: Comprehensive Integrated Master Plan on Increase in Military Presence

GCO-FPO provides an array of services to the island population through annual subgrants it makes under the Services*Training*Officers*Prosecutors (STOP) Violence Against Women (VAW) formula grant program. Annual grants of roughly \$648,000 per year are based on the census population. Obviously, increased military presence would place an impact on services that are already limited.

Mandatory funding levels are distributed under five areas: Law enforcement, prosecution, courts, services (non-profit organizations), and discretionary (GCO-FPO).

Subgrantee services/projects are as follows:

- **Alee Shelter** – provides housing for battered women and their children;
- **Archdiocese of Agana** – faith-based training project;
- **Department of Law** – Prosecution Support Projects;
- **Department of Law** – Consortium Project;
- **Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse** – Healing Hearts Crisis Center and forensic medical examination support;
- **Erica's House Visitation Center** – Safe exchange/visitation center;
- **GCO-FPO** – Outreach projects via public awareness campaigns (to include workplace training, village-to-village outreach awareness events with myriad community-based organizations, to include the military);

- **Guam Police Department** – Training Projects, Victims Assistance Unit and Criminal Investigations Section Support;
- **Guma'Mami, Inc.** – Services for the elderly and persons with special needs;
- **Public Defender Service Corporation** – Legal advocacy;
- **Superior Court of Guam** – Judicial Education and support staff to assist court marshals, probation and Client Services and Family Counseling projects; and
- **Victim Advocates Reaching Out** – Victim advocacy and referral services for victims of violence against women and their children.

GCO-FPO continues to compete in several discretionary grant programs. A planning grant award has been received under the **Safe Havens: Safe Visitation and Safe Exchange Center program** and are currently awaiting an award for roughly \$443,844 under the **Rural Domestic Violence and Child Victimization Enforcement Grant program**.
